

Safeguarding Policy

Safeguarding can be defined as protecting vulnerable individuals/adults at risk from abuse, neglect or any form of harm. At the College of Psychic studies, we value the importance of protecting all our employees, students and wider community and have many policies in place to support, including a dedicated Safeguarding policy.

Our Safeguarding policy sets out to define the processes and procedures our organisation has in place, so that we can provide employees, volunteers and trustees with the framework they need in order to keep other employees and students safe and secure whilst in our organisation.

Included within our Safeguarding policy: -

- Definitions, principals and values of safeguarding
- Contact details of our safeguarding team and clarity of roles and responsibilities
- Definitions and descriptions of how our organisation operates to support a safe learning environment for all
- Details of our adult protection procedures; how to handle and report any concerns; explanation of each step of the process and how we deal with allegations
- Details of how to deal with a concern being raised our guiding principles (Recieve, Reassure, Respond, Report, Record, Remember, Review)
- Links to other related policies, as well as abuse definitions and indicators
